PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

What a great week. We have had the Department ipad team in, letting our students play and access ipads and some great new apps. In the Primary classes, Whirly Word was a hit and in the infants classes the Playschool app gave the students the opportunity to record their own animated movie. There was much laughter and heaps of fun with some of the word building and letter recognition apps in the playgroup ipad group too. It was amazing seeing how some of our young playgroup students (0-5years) were able to navigate their way around the ipad. The Sunraysia Daily also paid us a visit yesterday to have a look at the ipad workshops and talk to me about our fantastic school. I told them how happy I am at Buronga Public School and just how great this school is.

In the last 2 weeks of the term we will be holding two open mornings so future students and their parents can have a look around our wonderful school. The dates are: Tuesday 19th June (Week 9) and Wed 27th June (Week10). Both these open mornings will be from 9:30 - 10:30 am, with our LEGs group providing a morning tea for these special visitors. If you know anyone who is interested in coming and having a look, please tell them about these days and get them to contact the school to let us know numbers. They will be able to have a walk around, visit classrooms and hear from some of our teaching team about the amazing programs at Buronga Public School. They can pick up an information pack on the day, which will have dates and times of our Kindergarten transition program for Kindy students starting in 2013 too. People attending this open day don't just have to have students ready to start next year, they might also be interested in joining our Playgroup or one of our older classes.

A final reminder to make sure your children get to school by 9 am. It is so important that students don't miss anytime in the morning. Just turning up 10 mins late only 2 days per week means by the end of term they have missed over 3 hours of learning. They are then behind their peers and that means the harder they have to work to catch up. Being late also disrupts the rest of the class and makes it harder for other students to remain focused. Please ensure your children are at school by 9am everyday. I will be checking this and making phone calls to families over the next couple of weeks. Going to bed a bit earlier is also important for all our students K-6. If they get to bed at a reasonable time, then they will be ready for learning the next day and much happier. If your child is going to have a late night, aim for it to be on a Friday or Saturday night. If your child is going to be away or is sick you can also ring or text the school phone. Just let us know why they are away and we can record it for their class teacher. If you would prefer to write a note that is fine.

There will be no strike action within our school on Thursday. It is only for Victorian Schools. Our school will operate as normal.
