PLANT OF THE WEEK*

Time to start thinking about some early spring vegetables. If you want



to plant from seed, just plant in punnets or pots and keep them protected from frost until after Melbourne Cup day, when the frost risk is generally over. Maybe some tomatoes, lettuce, capsicums and silver beet ready to get into the garden when the weather warms up for a super early crop! DON'T PLANT THEM OUT IN THE OPEN YET THOUGH AS FROST WILL KILL THEM! Happy gardening!!!







Stuffed capsicum


- 3 capsicum (we used red, yellow and green), halved, seeds removed
- 1/4 cup (60ml) olive oil
- 150g ricotta cheese
- 150g cherry tomatoes, halved
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced
- Grated rind of 1 lemon
- 1 garlic clove, crushed
- 1/2 cup torn basil leaves

Step 1

Preheat oven to 180°C.

- Toss the capsicum in half the oil, then place on a baking tray.
- Combine ricotta, tomatoes, onion, rind, garlic and half the basil, then use to fill the capsicum.

1. Drizzle with remaining oil and bake for 20-25 minutes. Garnish with remaining basil
