1 2 3 Sheep! is a beautifully crafted counting game for young learners that adapts to match their progress.

Players explore counting concepts in three fun activities - flying a helicopter around the farm, herding sheep into pens and guiding the sheepdog into the ute. Kids are drawn in with friendly, detailed graphics, playful audio and lots of humorous encouragement.

The easy-to-follow instructions require basic reading ability, but with a parent or teacher's help even young children are able to play independently within a short time.

1 2 3 Sheep! was developed in consultation with teachers and has been evaluated by students in the classroom environment.



LIBRARY & OUTDOOR EDUCATION

OUTDOOR EDUCATION NEWS

In Outdoor Education/Science last week we looked at where some of our food comes from in K/1/2. Last week we learned about bees and honey. We looked at the way bees work together in their hive and make honey. Grade 3/4 and 5/6 will this term be working on some science challenges. For the first 4 weeks, we will be working on creating a vehicle that can move under its own power over three metres on the concrete basketball court. Batteries will not be used so we will need to explore other methods of making things move. Grade 3/4 will be working on a challenge to design, plan and construct a container that will preserve an egg when dropped from the top of the metal stairs onto the hard, unforgiving concrete below..... The tasks will involve a comprehensive design process and evaluation of the effectiveness of the design at the completion of the challenge.

The scarecrows went very well at the Botanic Gardens Scarecrow display over the school holidays. They are now going to the Cardross Show so if you missed them over the holidays, go and see them in Cardross.

The chickens that hatched last term are now at the farm and growing quickly. They will come back for a visit in a week or so to look at how they have grown and changed. The school chooks will return next week.

The orchards and vegetable gardens are looking fantastic and look like they have quite a crop developing on them.

The Waterweek On Show activities today were fantastic! The students loved finding out about our river and water quality. Ask them about what they learned about and experienced!

Base muffin recipe

A Stephanie Alexander Recipe

Preheat oven to 180

220g SRF

1/2 cup castor sugar

3/4 cup milk

1 egg

1/2 cup vegetable oil

Mix sifted flour and castor sugar

Combine milk, egg and oil in a separate bowl and whisk lightly

Make a well in the centre if the dry ingredients, pour in liquid and mix lightly.

Choc Chip Muffins

Add 1 cup of chocolate chips

Cheese, onion and Bacon Muffins

To make savoury muffins, omit the sugar, add a pinch of salt and some pepper. Add your flavourings

100g diced and sautéed bacon

Spring onion, sautéed,

1cup of grated cheese.

Spoon into muffin pans, bake for 20-25 mins.

Addition Snap

Players divide the cards evenly between themselves. At the same time each player turns over one card. Players add the two numbers together as quickly as possible and say the answer out loud.
