We are now half way through the term.

I have been on leave the last couple of weeks and I would like to thank Merren Cock for relieving in my place.

Next week we have our sister school, Narraweena PS, coming to visit us. There will be 3 teachers, including their specialist French teacher and their AP, Sally Bell, accompanying the six Year 6 students. We have activities organised for the Buronga Year 5/6 students (please see the note going home today) and all other students in the school will experience French lessons and be taught by the other visiting teachers during the week. It should be very exciting.

This Thursday we have Questacon, from Canberra coming to visit and run specialised workshops with all students K-6. This will be an exciting opportunity for all students to see and experience this amazing science team. There will be no cost to students for this event, the school will cover the cost.

I would like to thank Mr Stewart for running the District Athletics carnival. The feedback I have had from all schools involved was outstanding, saying that was it was a well run day.

I would also like to thank Nello for running NAIDOC day a couple of weeks ago. It was such a success, with our local pre-school even coming to be involved on the day. A huge thank you to all the Parents and carers that came up to help on the day too.

At the end of the term all students (K-6) will be attending swimming lessons at the Mildura Waves pool. The cost for this is; one child \$20 and \$40 for 2 or more students (from the same family) for the 2 weeks. All students attend the lessons and receive a certificate of their achievement for the 2 weeks. If you need another note, please see the office.

During the last week of term Year 6 students attend the Canberra excursion. The school only asks students pay some of what it costs us to send them, the school funds the rest. A note has already gone home about this.

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
Book of the Fortnight

Ricotta Cheese Recipe

1 Litre full cream milk

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup cream

2 tablespoons white vinegar

Put milk in saucepan and on the stove. Add cream and stir. Heat until 93 degrees Celsius. Take off heat. Add vinegar and stir far a couple of minutes. Refrigerate for a 4-5 hours. Drain the whey off the curd through a fine colander and press out excess liquid. Turn onto a plate and enjoy on your sandwiches, or maybe make a cheesecake.

3/4 NEWS

Year 3/4 have been working very hard this fortnight. In Literacy, we have been writing a comprehensive recount/procedure of our last cooking session. We have also been learning more about verbs and adverbs, nouns and adjectives and how we use them to make our writing more interesting! In maths, students have been practicing their times tables, reviewing 3D shapes and learning about the factors of numbers.

Some students have not been bringing their reader regularly. I will be making this a priority for the rest of this term. There are lots of aspects to reading well. Practising at home as well as the work we do at school helps students consolidate all these important skills.

This term's theme is Local Government and we were very happy to have Mr Brian Wakefield, Wentworth Council's Deputy Mayor, in to talk to the class on Wednesday. The students learned a great deal and Mr Wakefield enjoyed talking to the class.

We are making hand-sewn sheep for the Wentworth show, so look for our little sheep if you are going out in a couple of weeks.

There is so much happening for the test of term. Very busy! Chickens will be hatching in the room in week eight. Book week activities, Questacon Science visit, Wentworth Show, Naraweena visit... Busy, Busy!!!
