The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide our school with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. I want to assure you that the survey is confidential and school staff will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 14 March and 8 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

The Internet & Social Media

As you would be aware social media an ever increasing presence in our lives and unless, managed to be used in a way that enhances our lives, can cause serious and ongoing issues.

NSW Department of Education Schools all operate under a Code of Conduct, where we are obliged to follow policy in relation to the use of technology and social media in association with our school. These policies are developed to protect students, staff and the school community as a whole. I have include information from these polices and toolkits for your information. If you would like further information, please contact the school and arrange a time to meet to further discuss any issues you may have.

When we use social media, everyone has the ability to publish online. With that comes the same responsibilities as commenting in a newspaper or any other public printed material. In relation to our school we need to consider that any negative sentiment, even those that are isolated, out of context or personal may be the first thing that the general public might see about our school when they do a search online for information.

We also need to be mindful that no information should be published if that could "reasonably identify a student, staff member, community member or any other person unless they have permission from that person or those people."

Defamation is yet another issue related to the inappropriate use of social media in relation to the school setting. "Defamation is the publication, declaration or broadcast of material that is capable of lowering a person in the estimation of others."

Whilst is easy to recognise the pitfalls of social media in certain situations, it can also be a valuable and effective form of communication and a great way of connecting with people when used in the right way. Along with the advantages of using social media comes the responsibility of following expectations and guidelines.

If we are able to model and teach our students/children these expectations, hopefully their experiences on social media will be positive ones.

Keeping Kids Safe Online

You can monitor and supervise your child's use of the internet in several ways:

• Talk with all family members about internet access. Monitoring works best if you can have calm and frank discussions with your child about his/her internet activities.

• Keep your desktop computer in a family area, or make sure your child uses tablets, phones and hand-held devices where you can see her/him. If possible, avoid online activity in a study or bedroom. This helps you keep an eye on how long your child is online as well as what websites they are visiting.

• Turn off all internet-accessing devices at night, including mobile phones, and keep portable devices in a common family space.

• Together with your child, set up some simple and fair rules about internet use. For example, set a reasonable limit on your child's <u>screen time</u>. Discuss how these rules apply outside your home.

• Let your child know that social networking sites such as Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest and Instagram don't allow children aged under 13 years to set up accounts. You can direct your child to more age-appropriate sites such as Moshi Monsters or Club Penguin instead.

Recipes of the Week

Fresh Tomato Sauce

From the Cooks' Champion by Stephanie Alexander 500g ripe tomatoes, cored, seeded and roughly sliced

2 cloves of garlic, sliced

1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil, salt, freshly ground black pepper

Tumble tomato, onion and garlic with oil and put into a saucepan

Cook over moderate heat for about 15 minutes, for a thicker sauce, simmer for longer

5 minutes before serving add shredded fresh basil leaves and stir through. Check for seasoning.

Fresh Pasta

For a meal allow 1 egg per person. Use 000 flour for best results, although you can use plain flour.

Make a well in the flour, add the egg and mix with your finger, coating the egg until combined and then work with your hands.

Use a rolling pin to roll into sheets, folding and refolding until it has the correct look and consistency. Cut into ribbons and allow to dry for about half an hour.

Cook in well salted boiling water.

General Reminders

Early to School – Teacher supervision at school begins at 8.30am. Please do not send students to school early as there is no teacher supervision before this time and this becomes a duty of care issue.

Please remember the Bus Zone out the front of the school. We have had some instances where the bus has had difficulty pulling into the kerb due to cars parked in the way.

Police regularly patrol school zones, especially during drop off and pick up. Fines do apply if you are parked in the bus zone at these times.
