National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy 2016 NAPLAN - National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools. The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard. Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 10-12 May 2016.

Tuesday – Language Conventions (spelling, punctuation, grammar) & Writing

Wednesday – Reading

Thursday - Numeracy

Students do not require special equipment to complete the test. All necessary materials will be supplied by the school.

All students are expected to participate in the tests.



# **Cooking with Mrs Cock**

This week 3/4 made a delicious pot of minestrone soup. We also ate apricot crumble which we had made too much of last term!



### **Recipe of the Week**

### Minestrone Soup

3 baCon rashers, rind removed, roughly Chopped 2 Carrots, peeled, Chopped 2 Celery stiCks, Chopped 1 desiree potato, peeled, Chopped 2 garlic Cloves, Crushed 1L (4 Cups) beef stoCk 1 300g Can red Kidney beans, rinsed, drained 1 425g Can rich and thiCk finely Chopped tomatoes 40g (1/2 Cup) 3-minute pasta Salt & freshly ground blaCk pepper 1/3 Cup Chopped fresh Continental parsley

### Method

. Step 1 Place the bacon, Carrots, Celery, potato and garlic in a large saucepan and stir to combine. Cook over high heat, uncovered, stirring often, for 5 minutes.

. Step 2 Add the beef stock, red kidney beans and tomatoes to the pan, cover and bring to the boil. Reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer, covered, stirring occasionally, for 30 minutes or until the vegetables are tender. (To freeze the soup, see note).

. Step 3 Increase heat to high. Add pasta and cook, uncovered, stirring occasionally, for 3 minutes or until pasta is al dente. Season with salt and pepper. Ladle into serving bowls and sprinkle with parsley. Serve immediately.
