Year 1/2 Cooking

Lemonade Scones

Ingredients:

• 4 cups of self-raising flour.

• 300mls of lemonade. 300mls of cream.

Method:



- Wash your hands.
 Using a mixing bowl put S.R. flour in.
 - 3. Pour in the lemonade.
- 4. Pour in the cream.

- 6. Place dough onto floured board.
