Principal Message

At Buronga Public School we continue our positive behaviour for learning journey.

Students at Buronga engage in activities to promote our school values of Respectful, Responsible, Safe and Successful.

Every student participates in explicit classroom discussions and lessons to teach these values and the associated behaviours. Our aim is to teach students expected behaviours and provide an environment to support success.

We have implemented a system to support positive behaviour at Buronga Public School which involves a flow chart outlining our processes the Department of Education Behaviour Code. These documents can be found on our school website and on the Skoolbag app.

These documents may provide some insight as to how we deal with issues at school and the consistent process we follow for all students. If you have any questions, please call and arrange a time to meet with your child's class teacher, the Assistant Principal, Wellbeing teacher or myself.

Families are important members of the school community and we appreciate your input and believe all our stakeholders need to be informed.

When schools and families work together toward a common goal of helping all children to be successful, it is much more likely to happen. Families have valuable insights and information about how their children learn best and what help they need. School personnel can help families support their children at home in learning and developing academic, social, emotional and behavioural skills. It is our aim to actively communicate with families on a regular basis so we have a common understanding of the Positive Behaviour for learning process.



We will keep adding to the information we provide through newsletters and skoolbag. Early next term we will hold an information session for parents and carers who would like to know more. Stay tuned for dates and times.

NAIDOC Day

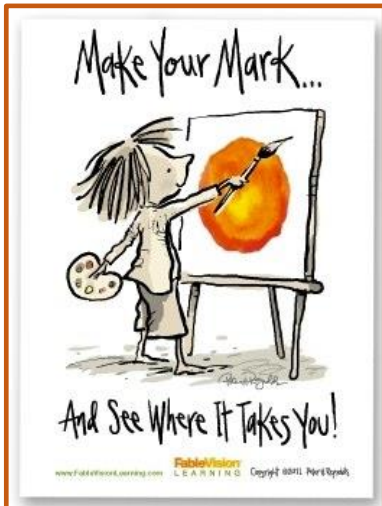

Greetings from Year 2/3!

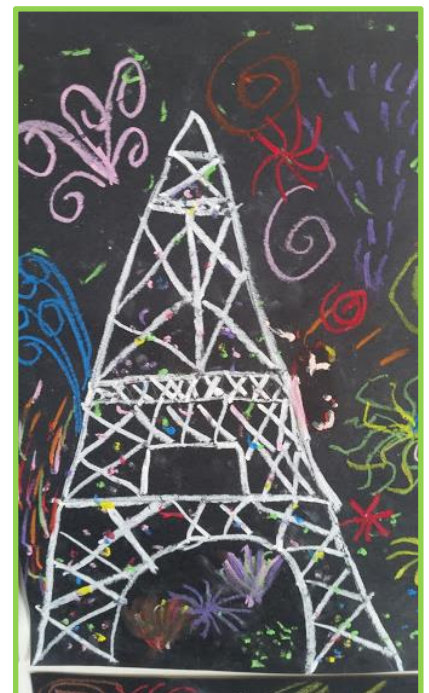


In Year 2/3 we have been working on developing our understanding of multiplication and how it relates to division through a series of fun games that have been introduced by Mrs. Robson.

Department of Education (DoE)

Behaviour code for students

NSW public schools are committed to providing safe, supportive and responsive learning environments for everyone. We teach and model the behaviours we value in our students.

Students are expected to:

- Respect other students, their teachers and school staff and community members
- Follow school and class rules and follow the directions of their teachers
- Strive for the highest standards in learning
- Respect all members of the school community and show courtesy to all students, teachers and community members
- Resolve conflict respectfully, calmly and fairly
- Comply with the school's uniform policy or dress code
- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Respect all property
- Not be violent or bring weapons, illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco into our schools
- Not bully, harass, intimidate or discriminate against anyone in our schools

Schools take strong action in response to behaviour that is detrimental to self or others or to the achievement of high quality teaching and learning.

Behaviour code for students: actions

Promoting the learning, wellbeing and safety of all students in NSW Public Schools is a high priority for the Department of Education.

We implement teaching and learning approaches to support the development of skills needed by students to meet our high standards for respectful, safe and engaged behaviour.

Respect

- Treat one another with dignity
- Speak and behave courteously
- Cooperate with others
- Develop positive and respectful relationships and think about the effect on relationships before acting
- Value the interests, ability and culture of others
- Dress appropriately by complying with the school uniform or dress code
- Take care with property

Safety

- Model and follow departmental, school and/or class codes of behaviour and conduct
- Negotiate and resolve conflict with empathy
- Take personal responsibility for behaviour and actions
- Care for self and others
- Avoid dangerous behaviour and encourage others to avoid dangerous behaviour

Engagement

- Attend school every day (unless legally excused)
- Arrive at school and class on time
- Be prepared for every lesson
- Actively participate in learning
- Aspire and strive to achieve the highest standards of learning

The principal and school staff, using their professional judgment, are best placed to maintain discipline and provide safe, supportive and responsive learning environments. The department provides a policy framework and resources such as Legal Issues Bulletins, access to specialist advice, and professional learning to guide principals and their staff in exercising their professional judgment. In this context the NSW Government and the Department of Education will back the authority and judgment of principals and school staff at the local level.

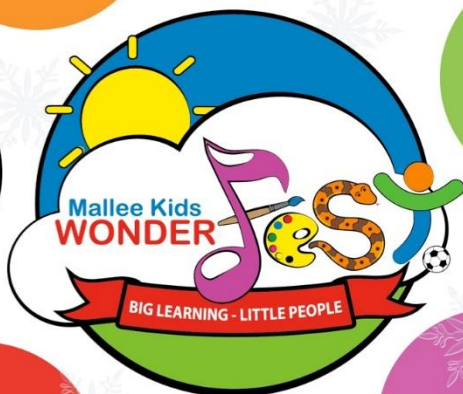
