### **PBL**

Positive Behaviour for Learning is an important part of what we do at Buronga. Students are engaged in explicit lessons every week to teach expected behaviours. We have been working on Responsible across all grades recently.

Students are expected to demonstrate these behaviours at our school in order to create a safe and positive environment for students, staff and parents.

### **Duty of Care**

Keeping our kids safe at school is a priority for all staff. One strategy we employ is to ask all students to leave by the front gates.

We have a duty teacher on the gate to monitor safety for all students. This enables us to know who is picking up students, when students leave and supervise safe road crossing.

Please arrange for students to be picked up at the front gates on Chapman Street.

Students who walk or ride bikes home are also asked to leave via these gates. The duty teacher then knows who has left the school grounds and at what time. (approximately)

#### **Notes**

Teachers would like notes to be taken to class teachers. This enables class teachers to have accurate information about who has returned the necessary paper work to participate in excursions and school events. Class teachers will then send notes on to the front office, where the information will be collated.

#### **After School Care**

We have the opportunity for a fantastic service to be offered to our students. After School Care is offered at Two Rivers Learning Centre in Buronga. Staff from the facility will collect students from Buronga Public School at the conclusion of the day and walk them to their facility. If you have decided to use this service, simply let us know the days your child is attending so we can create an accurate list for pick-up. If your arrangements change for pick up, give us a call and let us know.

Students accessing this service are picked up by Two Rivers staff at the chook yard gate. This means students are waiting in a safe place within the school grounds, rather than on a road or highway.

#### **Head Lice**

We have a number of cases of head lice reported at school.

Please check your child's hair and treat appropriately at home. If you need assistance treating your child's hair, please come and see us at the office and we can help.

Untreated cases cause extreme discomfort and allows head lice to spread throughout the school community.

Please talk with your children about not sharing hats and students with long hair consider wearing it tied up. These simple actions can minimise the risk of head lice spreading.

#### **Bayblades**



The next P&C Meeting will be held on Tuesday June 4th<sup>th</sup> – all are welcome to attend.












Thank you to all the parents, carers and loved ones who came along for our Mother's Day celebration.

Thank you to Eli who also assisted on the day at a checkpoint. I'm very convinced each competitor enjoyed a mist of water as they ran past.




















Year 5 students have been involved in NAPLAN tests. This year is the first year that Buronga School has completed these tests online.


For the last two weeks we have been lucky enough to have a Preservice teacher working in our classroom. Miss Hannah Schofield has been helping us in many different ways.






We have been learning about how things grow and change. As part of our investigation we have read the Pamela Allen story, 'The Potato People'.


It is about a boy Jack and his Grandma who make potato people on a rainy, wet day.


We made our own potato people before drawing and describing them and now we too will watch how they change.
